February 4, 2015

COMMITTEES

Neighborhoods and Education Committee

The next Neighborhood Leaders Alliance meeting was rescheduled for April 16, 2015, at 4 p.m. at One Water Street.

Grants Committee

The Incentive Grants Committee met at 3:30 p.m. today. They approved 50 percent of the Koco Java black awning with the name on the apron. Koco Java is located at 329 N. Main Street. The money will come from the Innes Street Grant. The project is estimated to cost \$1,151.

Nathan Coyle made a MOTION to approve 50 percent of the project. Deborah Harris seconded the motion with all committee members VOTING AYE. (3-0)

Let downtown businesses know that there are funds available.

Public Art Committee

The sculpture show installation and reception at the Edward and Susan Norvell residence is scheduled for March 20. Invitations will be mailed for this reception. The secretary will order

engraved name tags for new members; all attending members are asked to wear their CAC nametags to the reception.

Lynn presented a PowerPoint of the selected sculptures for this year's sculpture show. Some of the pieces from the 2014 show are now leaving and some will stay a little longer for the symposium RCCC is hosting for community college art professionals at the Waterworks Visual Art Gallery February 27.

OTHER BUSINESS

- CAC terms and nominations—last meeting a sheet was distributed with information regarding individual appointments and eligibility for serving another term. Carlton Jackson would like to serve another term and has the support of his employer, Duke Energy. Jessica Vess and Karl Sale would like to serve another term. Staff will follow up with Brian Davis. Sue McHugh may be able to serve a little longer, although she is scheduled to roll off. That will be up to City Council.
- Sue reported that the “repeat offenders” proposal has made progress via the Salisbury Police Department. She hopes to see action in the near future.
- The edited version of the Innes Street/Long Street Complete Streets adopted corridor plan is available online now at www.salisburync.gov. Hard copies of the adopted plan will be made available at the One Stop Shop located at 132 N. Main Street.
- Lynn provided some information on House Bill 36. State lawmakers' desire to prohibit regulation of building design in residential areas has come around again. - Secretary of the Department of Cultural Resources, Susan Kluttz, a few of her staff and elected officials will be in Salisbury Monday, February 9, to advocate for the historic preservation tax credit program.
